C (70-79), D (60-69), and F (0-59) and further used to differentiate all public schools.

TEA uses the Closing the Gaps domain to identify campuses that have consistently underperforming student groups. Any campus not identified for comprehensive support and improvement that has at least one consistently underperforming student group is identified for targeted support and improvement. Campuses are evaluated annually for identification.

Additionally, if any Title I or non-Title I campus does not attain a 67 percent four-year federal graduation rate for the all students group, the campus is identified for comprehensive support and improvement. Non-Title I campuses are not eligible for comprehensive support grant funding.
